

Background and funding 2019-2020

The PE and Sport Premium is paid directly to primary schools and is ring-fenced to spend on improving the quality of PE and sport provision for all their pupils.

The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following objective:

“To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. The focus of spending must lead to long-lasting impact that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.”

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

Rationale Behind Spending

Specialist Coaching

Every child has specialist coaching/quality first teaching by a qualified coach. (KI 1,2,4) ‘Active’ lunchtime clubs are provided on some days (KI 1, 2) PE assessments carried out by coach (KI 2) After school clubs available for children. (KI 1, 2, 4) Activities such as archery and cross country available. (KI 1, 4)

Access to local competitions.
